Citizenship Football

Materials:

- Green poster board with a football field drawn on it in chalk
- Questions (see below)
- Extra point questions (see below)
- Yards tags (see below)
- Football markers (see below)
- Three paper bags labeled Questions, Extra Point, and Yards

Preparation

Cut apart the questions, extra point questions, yards tags, and football markers.

Place the questions in the Questions bag, the extra point questions in the Extra Point bag, and the yards tags in the Yards bag.

Instructions

- 1. Divide the Scouts into two teams.- red team and blue team.
- 2. Give each team one of the football markers.
- 3. Place both football markers at the 50 yard line.
- 4. Have a coin toss to see which team goes first.
- 5. A member from the first team reaches in the Questions bag and draws a question.
- 6. If he answers correctly, he draws a tag from the Yards bag and moves his team's football forward that many yards. The next player on his team gets to draw a question.
- 7. If he answers incorrectly, the other team gets a turn.
- 8. When a team gets a touchdown, they get 6 points and they get to try to answer a question from the Extra Point bag for one or two more points. The points are indicated on the question cards.
- 9. If the team is at the 10 or 20 yard line, they may try for a field goal instead of a touchdown. In this case, when they read the question, give them three or four multiple choice answers, with one of them being the correct answer. If the player selects the correct answer they get 3 points.
- 10. After a team scores a touchdown or a field goal, they return their ball to the 50 yard line and the other team gets a turn.
- 11. When a question is answered correctly, it is removed from play. If it is answered incorrectly, it goes back in the bag. If most of the questions have been answered correctly, put them back in the bag and continue playing.
- 12. Play for a set amount of time. Or break the game into quarters and play this between other Citizen Activity badge requirements.
- 13. The team with the most points at the end wins.

Notes

You should go over the information in the questions with your Scouts before playing the game. The purpose of the game is to reinforce the answers.

You are the referee. Your decision is always final.
